Benicàssim is the perfect example of a Mediterranean beach resort. Its stunning coastline stretches for nearly seven kilometres and is split north to south into five beaches:

- Voramar
- Almadraba
- Torre de Sant Vicent
- Els Terrers
- Heliópolis

All five of these beaches have been awarded the European Blue Flag distinction, as well as ISO 14001 in environmental management. As if that weren't enough, Voramar, Almadraba and Torre San Vicente beaches have all additio-

nally received the Spanish Tourism Quality Institute's "Q" distinction and Turespaña's Commitment to Tourism Quality certificate.

And to make sure that nobody is left out of what Benicàssim's coastline has to offer, Almadraba beach has a disabled access point, with special walkways all the way to the seafront and manned by qualified personnel. It also has a set of amphibious chairs and other support material available. Heliópolis, Torre San Vicente and Voramar beaches also have disabled access points.

Villas of Benicàssim

Did you know that Benicàssim was at the heart of the action during the Belle Époque? The wealthy classes of nearby Valencia were the first to fall in love with the town's Mediterranean charm. From the end of the 19th century onwards, the cream of Valencian society, captivated by Benicàssim and all it had to offer, began to build coquettish summer homes all along the seafront. The town was transformed into one of the first tourist destinations of the Spanish Mediterranean. The personalities of their respective owners led to the division of these villas into two separate areas: the first known as Hell, after the many soirées and gatherings that often went on into the small hours, and a second known as the Celestial Court which, as its name suggests, was a place of peace and tranquillity. The two areas are separated by a section of no-man's land roughly halfway along the route dubbed Limbo. Today these resi-

dences make up what is known as the Route of the Villas, and they are the ideal setting for a relaxing family break.



Desert de les Palmes Natural Park

Just a few short kilometres away from Benicàssim is the Desert de les Palmes Natural Park which, contrary to what its name might suggest, is rich in flora, fauna and fascinating geological formations. One of the Castellon province's eight protected natural parks, it spans an area of 3200 hectares. On a clear day, from its highest point atop Mount Bartolo (729m) you can see as far as the distinctive rock formation of the Montgó Massif in the Alicante province, as well as the Columbretes Islands marine reserve out to sea. It is home to the stunning Spires of St. Àgueda flora microreserve (540m), whose breathtaking colour palate is the result of a varied and abundant plant community. It is also dotted with natural springs, such as Font Tallà, Font del Senyor and Font de la Teula, which complete the

sights and sounds of this beautiful natural setting.

The Desert de les Palmes Natural Park is also a must for all those who love to go hiking or cycling in nature. It has nine signposted routes, plus three specifically-designed for mountain biking.

FORMER MONASTERY

The peacefulness of the Desert de les Palmes Natural Park inspired the Discalced Carmelite Monks to build their first monastery there, on a flat bit of land amid ravines and at a height of 500 metres above sea level. Built between 1697 and 1733, some fifty years later (1783), a series of torrential rains and landslides severely compromised the structure of the monastery and the monks were forced to abandon their home in search of a more secure site.

Today, while visiting its ruins, the visitor can experience one of the most evocative sites in the entire natural park. Set against the backdrop of the Mediterranean Sea, these serene reminders of times gone by evoke the simplicity and sanctity that was lived here for the best part of a century.

NEW MONASTERY

After the old rooms were abandoned, work began on the new monastery at its current site, just a few metres from the old ruins. Built between 1784 and 1791, the structural elegance of the new monastery was determined by the Order of the Carmelite Monks and St. Teresa of Jesus. The various rooms and common areas are arranged around the church, found at the physical centre and spiritual heart of the architectural ensemble. Among them are those of the Religious Community and Spirituality Centre.

Among the religious figures who lived there is Brother Antonio de Jesús María, a Carmelite monk who is perhaps most remembered for his study of aromatic herbs, which led to his distilling and selling the famous Carmelite Liqueur of Benicàssim, one of the town's most prized local artisanal food products.






Montornés Castle: Desert de les Palmes

Benicàssim began life as a Moorish fiefdom dependent on the 16th-century Montornés Castle. It was made up of various farmsteads scattered about what is now Benicàssim. In 1242, the castle became the property of Pedro Sanz, personal scribe to King James I, in payment for his services during the Spanish Reconquista. Located on a steep peak in the Desert de les Palmes Natural Park, it offers breathtaking views and forms a defensive watch triangle with St. Vincent's Tower and the Casoleta de Salandó.

Cultural heritage from the 11th and 16th centuries



Sant Vicent Tower

Built in the 16th century and standing tall on the horizon to the far south of the Bernat Artola seafront promenade, it was once one of eighteen such look-out posts that guarded the coast of the entire Castellon province. In its past, this region has lived through troubled times with incessant pirate raids. In particular, Olla de Benicàssim cove was one of the preferred anchoring spots of pirates and Berbers, which is why St. Vincent's Tower was built here, on the order of the courts of Monzón.

The Torre de Sant Vicent Interpretation Centre currently has an interactive exhibition space dedicated to explaining the historical context in which the Sant Vincent and Sant Julià watchtowers were built, showing various aspects related to piracy and the Kingdom of Valencia coastal defence system between the 16th and 19th centuries.

Neo-classical architecture

The parish church was built under the patronage of the learned Don Francisco Pérez Bayer of Valencia. The neoclassical style of the period embodied the principles of architectural rationalism, which can be seen in the straight lines, balance and lack of baroque ornamentation typical of other Valencian churches. Its columns and capitals are typical of the Enlightenment period, as is its architectural layout.

Construction began in 1769 and would not be completed until 1776. Inside, visitors will find paintings by 18th-century local artist Camerón, from Segorbe (Castellon), including the large canvas that dominates the church's interior and the dome frescos. These paintings can be admired while walking through the temple, which has a rectangular layout with a single nave in the form of a Latin cross and no side chapels.

This temple holds a special place in Benicàssim's heart, not only because it is dedicated to the town's patron saint, who also lends his name to the town's biggest local holiday, but also because its construction ultimately dictated the current location of the town itself. It is therefore the symbol of the birth of Benicàssim.

Benicàssim is committed to offering its visitors a range eco-friendly tourism options for getting to know its privileged natural setting. An area of land bordered by both sea and mountains, it is a landscape full of stunning contrasts and home to a large variety of flora and fauna.

Its Vía Verde del Mar "Green Line", the old railroad that used to connect Benicàssim to Oropesa del Mar, is now an eco-friendly route that can be followed on foot or by bike. It runs along the coast

and gives you views of two of the old look-out posts that were used to protect the coastline from pirate raids.

For the more adventurous, Benicàssim also has family-friendly hiking routes to choose from. For instance, the walk up to Montornés Castle or the Route of the Spires of St. Àgueda which, starting at the town hall, takes you on a circular route through some of Benicàssim's most stunning landscapes. Mosaics of vibrant greens and paradisaical beaches will form memories that will stay with you and your family forever.

Local holidays

Bank holidays and traditions

For the most part, Benicàssim's local holidays have religious origins. During the patron saint day festivities in honour of St. Anthony Abad and St. Àgueda, in January, visitors will find an entire week full of events. The most popular are the bonfires held on the eve of St. Anthony's Day, the procession and blessing of livestock, and the decorated floats from which the traditional holy cake "coqueta" is shared out among those present. The pilgrimage to the hermitage of Santa Àgueda is celebrated on the Sunday closest to February 5th.

The festivities held in honour of St. Thomas of Villanueva, the patron saint of Benicàssim's parish church, are held during the week in which his saint's day falls (22nd September). Events not to be missed fill the streets, such as the traditional running of the bulls, open-air dances, bulls with wooden balls on their horns and fireworks. Perhaps the most important event is the presentation and official proclamation of the Queen and Child Queen of the festivities, as well as their honour courts, who, beginning on this special day, will reign for an entire year.

Don't miss the Feast of Corpus Christi to see the streets of Benicàssim decorated with flowers of every colour of the rainbow for the Eucharistic procession.

And finally, magic fills the beaches of Benicàssim in the small hours of 23rd June in honour of St. John's Day. On this night, the longest of the year –the summer solstice–, tradition brings residents and visitors alike to the seafront where, at midnight, they dip their feet in the sea and make wishes for the year to come. The magic is topped off with traditional dancing, as well as the sharing of traditional sweets, cakes and muscatel wines.

"PAELLA DAY" FESTIVAL OF AUTONOMOUS TOURIST INTEREST


Paella Day brings together tradition, gastronomy, fiesta and mass participation. Held on the Friday of the third week in January, it is one of the most anticipated events of the year, forming part of the celebrations in honour of St. Anthony Abad and St. Àgueda. Going back more than thirty years, this local festival is already a strongly-rooted tradition, and for one day in January transforms Benicàssim into the pioneer of the most emblematic of Valencian dishes, the paella. What's more, it is an event that is truly embraced by residents and visitors alike, who come to prepare and share their paellas. In recent years, some 25,000 people have come to Benicàssim to take part in this popular and authentic festival.

Benicàssim town has various venues suitable for meetings and conferences, including:

- **Casa Abadía:** an 18th-century building which currently houses the municipal tourist information office. It has two rooms: one meeting room with capacity of up to 30 people, and another conference room with capacity of up to 28 people.

- **Municipal Cinema-Theatre Francesc Tàrraga:** capacity for up to 380 people, and a full programme of events all year round.

- **Casa de Cultura:** conference room with capacity for up to 64 people. Plenary hall and 4 lecture theatres.

- **Espai de la música Mestre Vila:** used by the Music School, it has a large practice room and an auditorium for concerts with capacity for up to 200 people.

- **Pepe Falomir Amphitheatre:** new cultural space that breathes new life into one of the main beach areas, especially over the summer, with open-air music concerts and scenic arts performances.

- **Benicàssim hotels:** the majority of the hotels in Benicàssim have facilities suitable for large events.

- **Jardines K'sim:** large gardens for holding all kinds of open-air events plus a conservatory with capacity of up to 500 guests. Car park with 200 parking spaces. Ideal venue for large events.

- **Ópera Benicàssim:** architecture and elegance converge in a single space in this opera house. Extensive gardens, with outdoor natural pools. Everything is carefully prepared down to the smallest detail for all kinds of events. It has two large rooms with capacity for up to 400 people each.

- **Villas:** located along the seafront promenade, these buildings from the end of the 19th to the beginning of the 20th centuries are fully-equipped for events, such as Finca Los Pinos.

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS FOR USERS OF TOURIST SERVICES

Benicàssim, with its long-standing reputation as a tourist destination, is wholly committed to ensuring the highest quality across all of its services with the launch of the Comprehensive System for Tourist Destination Quality for our tourist services and businesses, the management of the environmental and tourism-related quality of our beaches as well as the municipal Tourism Office's Q for Tourism Quality certification.

Through this commitment to quality, we safeguard the wellbeing of our tourists, the conservation of our touristic resources and the tourist destination of Benicàssim as a whole.

* Text extracted from Act 15/2018, of 7 June, on tourism, leisure and hospitality in the Community of Valencia, (Articles 16 and 17), published in the Boletín Oficial del Estado, No.157, 29 June 2018.

*RIGHTS

- a) To receive objective, accurate, understandable and complete information from tourism companies, prior to procuring the services offered, as well as information on the final price with tax included. The right to be protected from misleading information or advertising in accordance with current regulations.
- b) To obtain the documents that confirm the terms of the procurement.
- c) To receive the tourism services under the conditions offered or agreed upon and, in any case, to receive a service whose nature and quality is in direct proportion to the category of the tourism company or establishment.
- d) To benefit from the accessible tourism spaces, infrastructures and services.
- e) To have open access to tourism establishments and services under the terms established in the legislation.
- f) Tourism establishments must comply with the regulations regarding the safety of their facilities and fire protection as well as specific tourism regulations.
- g) To be clearly informed on the facilities and services that may pose a risk and the safety measures adopted in that respect.

*OBLIGATIONS

a) To respect the traditions and social and cultural practices of the tourist destinations as well as their resources and value.

b) To respect the natural environment, cultural and historical heritage and tourist resources.

c) To pay for the procured services, whether upon receipt of the invoice, or at the time, place and manner agreed upon. The submission of a complaint or claim under no circumstances implies exemption from payment.

d) With regards to tourist accommodation services, to respect the date and time agreed upon for departure from the establishment, leaving the occupied accommodation unit empty.

e) To observe rules regarding respect, education, social cohabitation, dress and hygiene for proper use of the tourist establishments and services.

f) To respect the facilities and equipment of the tourist establishments and companies.

g) To respect the internal rules of the tourist establishments, the timetables and the rules of conduct of the places visited and when carrying out tourist activities.

h) To receive an invoice or proof of payment for the tourism service provided with the information required by current legislation.

i) To file claims and complaints and obtain accessible and accurate information on the submission procedure and processing thereof, and to be able to resort to extrajudicial conflict resolution through mediation and arbitration. Furthermore, the competent public administration is obliged to ensure the utmost efficiency in the handling and processing of the claims and complaints filed.

j) To resort to arbitration methods for the extrajudicial resolution of conflicts with financial implications.

k) To request that the distinctive accreditations for the classification of the establishment, the capacity, the prices of the services offered, and any other activity variable are publicly displayed in a highly visible place, as well as the appropriate quality marks.
